

CITY HIGHLIGHTS

Cochrane Park Grand Re-Opening

On September 30, the city hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony to commemorate the completion of the first phase of the Cochrane Memorial Park reconstruction project. This project is vital to improving Yelm's water reclamation infrastructure and will play a key role in our water mitigation plan. All of the water in the park is Class A reclaimed water

from the Water Reclamation Facility and goes back into the ground to recharge the aquifer. Once the entire project is complete, there will be a total of 3 Rapid Infiltration Basins (RIB), 3 water treatment features that will increase the water outflow to the park from 50 gallons a minute, to 250 gallons a minute, a new gazebo area and water fountain, as well as an upgraded restroom facility. Construction on phase 2 will begin in late 2022 or early 2023.



Utility Moratorium Expires September 30, 2021



On September 30, 2021 Proclamation 20–23.15, the prohibition of utility disconnection during the COVID–19 pandemic, will expire. The City of Yelm recognizes the many challenges that our residents faced during the pandemic and are willing to work with customers who have been financially impacted by the public health emergency.

Residents with past due water accounts with the City of Yelm currently have two options for keeping their services turned on once the moratorium expires:

- 1. Pay their account off in full before October 31, 2021
- 2. Sign a contract before October 31, 2021 for an up to 12-month payment plan to pay off their past due amount

Starting November 1, 2021 the City of Yelm will be going back to the normal shut off schedule and policies. For questions or concerns please reach out to the Community Services Department at (360) 458–3244.

Washington's Single-Use Plastic Bag Ban



Due to supply chain issues of compliant bags during the COVID-19 pandemic, Gov. Jay Inslee delayed implementation of the bag ban. On July 13, the Governor rescinded the proclamation and set the single-use plastic bag ban effective date for October 1, 2021.
